To ensure the successful shipment of goods destined for the XVII China – Latin America and the Caribbean Business Summit, we recommend that you proceed as indicated below:

1. Participant Registration

1.1 Those planning to import goods into the nation as part of the XVII China-Latin America and Caribbean Business Summit are required to fill out the online registration form.

1.2 The following routes exist for the entry of the goods used in the Business Summit into the nation:

- a) Temporary import of commodities arriving as cargo, with subsequent export in the same state.
- b) Luggage of the traveler, whether it is accompanied or not.
- c) Fast delivery shipping or Courier shipments.


2. Official Documents

The entry of merchandise into the country must be supported by the following documents:

- a) Copy of the commercial invoice or packing list, containing the following information: unit of measure, quantity, commercial description and dollar value (USD) of the goods.
- b) A transport document (BL, AWB, or Bill of Lading) must be shown if the products are entering as cargo.
- c) The participant's vehicle registration card must be shown if they intend to enter through a land border.
- d) Documentation verifying compliance with non-tariff rules, such as sanitary and phytosanitary licenses, if applicable.

The documentation mentioned in letters a), b) and c) will be uploaded in the participant's registration form. **Spanish or English may be used for the documents' submission.**

The following map displays the location of the customs offices that are authorized to handle the entry of merchandise:



3. Procedure for the temporary importation of merchandise.

3.1 When goods worth no more than 200 (USD) are brought into the country as cargo or "accompanied/unaccompanied luggage of the traveler" and are not subject to non-tariff regulations, the customs authority at the Post Border Control of entry into the country will prepare the temporary import declaration ex officio with re-export in the same state.

Cases that do not satisfy these requirements will be managed by the customs agency.

3.2 For the participant is required to use the services of a Nicaraguan-approved customs agency.

Accreditation will be carried out by indicating the company name in the "Customs Agency" field of the registration form.

3.3 The Customs authorization for temporary import with re-export in the same state of the goods will be issued on the Registration Form generated from the website.

3.4 Temporary import with re-export in the same state of the goods will be carried out through the registration of the customs declaration.

3.5 To produce the temporary import declaration with re-export in the same state, which was prepared at the customs office of entrance into the national territory, to the customs authority at the exit border control post for the cancellation of the regime, the participant must retain a copy of it.

3.6 The services fee that the customs authority will collect are indicated below:

Note: The Nicaraguan customs agency must take the required steps to get authorization from the regulatory body prior to the goods mentioned above arriving in the country.

5. Removal of the temporary import regime under same condition re-exportation

The temporary import declaration shall be cancelled with the presentation of the re-export declaration, which must be registered prior to the merchandise departure from Nicaragua without any prior authorization.

When the customs authority delivers the temporary import declaration with re-export in the same state, the customs agency will create the re-export declaration.

6. Removal of the temporary import regime according to the import destination

The merchandise that will be displayed at the Summit, either for use or consumption in Nicaragua, must be imported previous compliance to all applicable tax duties and non-tariff regulations.

7. Important considerations

7.1 The merchandise to be exhibited at the Summit will not be subject to the presentation of a guarantee for its adherence to the temporary import regime under same condition re-exportation.

7.2 The documents for the merchandise (invoice, packing list, Bill of Landing, air waybill, bill of lading, etc.) must indicate "Name of exhibitor/XVII China - Latin America and the Caribbean Business Summit".

7.3 Deadline for registration and arrival of goods.

7.4 Consignment Instructions and shipping marks.

XVII China-Latin America and the Caribbean Business Summit related merchandise must be consigned as " Freight Prepaid" and its documentation must be displayed as follows once they enter the country:
